4. Work Through Agenda

Community Health Advocate (CHA) Community course – Discussion

Carla Clasen reviewed the course taught at Sinclair Community College, ALH 210 - Introduction to Community Health Advocacy. The idea is to bring the course back into the community.

Should a practicum element be added?

What could a CHA do in your agency?

- Help seniors and access needs (DMHA) when people are shut in
- Mammography education, lead education
- Faith based organizations – work with volunteers
- Places with teen services
- Good neighbor house
- WIC Child & Family
- Homeless clinic

It was asked: would you or your agency be willing to work with us to try to have a practicum?

- Monica will look into working together (Carla Knox 910-5319 supervisor)

- Lucia – Promotores program could use CHA students as mentors. Spanish speaking women needing help filling out forms.
- Mariann – Definitely!!

How much time should students spend?

- A whole quarter – DMHA over lunchtime programs where visibility is important. People see them and feel comfortable talking
- Different agencies would need different structure
- Minimum of 36 hours and report back to their class – nursing students (health ministries)
- Would like parameters – what can they do? Hour limit
- Partner student nurses and CHA's
- Organizational needs

Organizational Exchange:

Bob Mullins – ADAMHS – MVH Born free program that delivers drug-free babies has been cancelled.

Marianne Urban – Dayton Public Schools – Nurses are back after a 2 week break. Thurgood Marshall HS has opened to students, official opening will be later. Groundbreakings continue for another new school.

Bill Spears – WSU Center for Healthy Communities – The Community Wellness project is moving along. Healthy Dayton has agreed to combine with the Wellness project. The next meeting is January 28th at 3:00 at the Kettering Center.

Maggie Barlow – FESN has the second 6-month renewal. Success was a goal set of 155 served, reality was 260 families served; over 900 people. The model of faith-based networking really works.

Joanne Hale – Sunrise – is under transition. Weed & Seed applying for money which Susan and Norma will talk about. The Homeless Coalition is working on utility crisis. The volume of callers at the center total a need of 4 million dollars - \$180,000 were obtained.

Weed & Seed is targeting prostitution in the city. The Criminal Justice Council has appointed a subcommittee to work with Weed & Seed to find housing for prostitutes i.e. Oasis House. CHC is involved in a research aspect. Addiction in prostitutes - 90-95% of the money goes to their drug dealers.

Jennifer Boyd - Public Health - Dayton & Montgomery County – Health Education and Promotion. The new year brings education in schools and churches. The Martin Luther King celebration on the 21st, movie “Grace” will be shown at the Neon 12-2pm. Lunch will be provided by McDonalds. They are also working on several grant initiatives.

Patty Griswold - East Dayton Health Center – is also in transition. Federal qualified Health centers Drew and Vogel are now together. Grant submitted in December, but won't hear until Sept. Hospital fiscal support for this year until federal funding begins. New name is Community Health Centers of Dayton.

Susan Woodbury – Southeast Priority Board/Sunrise – boards are working to increase membership. Susan is the new financial aid person at Sunrise and is homeless steering committee chair of Weed & Seed. Statistics – for everyone who reports being in a

shelter, there are 2 who report living in their car or with friends. Are receiving 60-70 calls a day for money assistance for rent or water. Other counties are having the same load as well.

Norma Ryan – SE Weed & Seed/FESN – to continue with Joanne’s report on prostitution in the city, she has been learning about ‘Den Mothers’. These are women who work in clubs taking care of ‘her girls’. Norma and Susan are continuing their meth lab backpack presentations.

Kay Parent – Center for Healthy Communities – reviewed the summit information attached to the CHC report. She encouraged everyone to attend. It addresses making getting physically active attractive.

Beverly Pendergast – NE Priority Board – Staff has moved downtown. Will be in the north quadrant for the Martin Luther King Day March.

Sharon Becker – Good Samaritan Health Ministries – a workshop will be presented March 13 & 14, “The Gift of Caring Presence”. A grant from Physicians Charitable Trust will fund portable defibrillator machines for churches.

Chris VanDenburgh – Kettering Medical Center Network / Healthy Dayton – 1st at Kettering – Basic Training for Faith Community Nurses. Wednesday nights from March 12-May 21 – 33/34 CEU hours. Healthy Churches initiative in December sponsored the Biggest Winner Contest. Until Feb 1 churches have 12 weeks to do a program. The winning church gets \$10,000 for outreach which must address body/mind/spirit. Chris will share her proposal with anyone wishing to duplicate the effort.

Dawn Morton – Wright State University SOPP They are looking for a new dean. Increase in mental health services at Ellis and WSU means hiring 3 new staff. New practice sites are Daybreak and University of Cincinnati Counseling Center.

Marilyn Rodney – Sinclair Community College Service Learning – is growing. More disciplines on board now. Events - “Engage Your Mind!”, Martin Luther King March at Roosevelt to Courthouse Square, Global Awareness events, Wellness Resource Center presentation Feb 7, 11-12pm. Pam Reichel from Premier Community Health will address health issues related to specific groups.

Nancy Brown – passed out flyers on the Neighborhood Leadership class. Ask for applications this week, it is free. In February try to attend the Techfest 2008. It is a wonderful experience for the family.

Lucia Prier - East End Community Center – is new to CAB. She works in Latino Family Advocacy program which does case management, provides leadership opportunities to Latinos through the Promotores program, does systems advocacy and trainings.

Monica Rohr – DMHA – Relocations are still occurring. Some people are still at Parkside and are hard to place. Barriers to work on are bills people left behind i.e. utilities. Inspection standards are tough so housing is hard to find. Home ownership program has had 30 closings so far.

Jill Vaniman – Public Health – Dayton & Mont. Co –Notes that their e-mail addresses have changed and are now *name@phdmc.org*. The old address has now been cut off.

Jill passed out a flyer – Schedule of SIDS Workshops – ABC’s of Safe Sleep – There are billboards for the campaign and the hospitals have sleepers.

Bobbe Gray - Wright State University CoNH – Dec 6th the Ohio Board of Regents approved the new Doctoral program. This is a Doctor of Nursing Practice degree with a strong clinical rather than an academic focus.
