Fall 2006 Medicaid Outreach Training Evaluation:

- ✓ Approximately 70 people in attendance, and the evaluations (overall) rated in the 90 percentile
- ✓ There is no need for too many changes.
- ✓ The primary concern in the evaluations included space, content, facilities, and need for question/answer.
- ✓ It was suggested that it is time to reconsider the format for the training.
- ✓ Perhaps use the HealthLink Miami Valley Training Format
- ✓ Have less speakers; Perhaps have 3 to 4 speaker with a panel at the end of the session for questions/answers
- ✓ Cut down content so training doesn't feel rushed- appears to be a key point
- ✓ Perhaps extend time into a day-long training. There were concerns that the attendees might have difficulty in getting that much time free from work.
- ✓ Consider different location for the training since the last training was tight for space: Madison Lakes, Sinclair, Conference room at a hospital, or even a larger room at the Job Center.
- ✓ Plan for set-up (Kim stated that before the meeting, she and Kim Upshaw had to re-set the room because it was disordered upon arrival)
- ✓ If we choose to have a longer training, we will have to account for meals, such as boxed lunches. This could be subsidized with a \$10 fee.
- ✓ Benefits of longer training include a possible break-out session, workshops, networking.
- ✓ If we reserve a different room at the Job Center, perhaps we could meet in the large room (Room B) and then break out into smaller sessions.
- ✓ We will set this topic of changing MOC Training on the Agenda for detailed discussion for February 2007 meeting.
