Learning from events in the New Orleans area following Hurricane Katrina they are setting up a local response program, Homeland Emergency Learning and Preparedness Center (H.E.L.P). This program will provide emergency disaster assistance for up to 72 hours, allowing time for more aid to arrive. A Neighborhood Emergency Help Center (NEHC) and Acute Care Center (ACC) will be set up and staffed by volunteers not presently associated with a disaster program within their job in the community. The ACC must be capable of housing 1000 for up to 72 hours without resupply. The NEHC is the door through which people will enter the system and is designed to decrease the burden on hospital emergency departments. The HIETM system will also be used.

*Here are a few of the many accomplishments that have been achieved in the School since our last community notes. Reported by Dawn Morton: SOPP's Counseling and Wellness Services, under Bob Rando's direction, received one of 34 national grants for Campus Suicide Prevention totaling \$62,720. Counseling and Wellness Services sponsored the National Depression Screening Day on Oct 5, 2006, and will be participating in the "American Psychiatric Association Healthy Minds Initiative" with sponsorship by the WSU Department of Psychiatry and WSU Student Affairs. The Counseling and Wellness Center was relocated to the Student Union on the first floor this Spring, 2007.

Janeece Warfield was awarded a Department of Education, child care program grant for \$189,123. Jeff Allen presented at the aging/dementia segment of the Mini Medical school series on Oct 17th.

Janeece Warfield has a featured spot on a newsletter article that she wrote on the Marshak Interaction Method (MIM) which was featured in the Official Newsletter of the Ohio Association for Infant Mental Health's "Baby Talk" Fall 2006, vol 6 issue 1. In addition, featured in Issue 2 of this newsletter was The Collaborative Peer Supervision Group which has a new on-line video that Dr. Michael Thomasgard and Janeece collaborated on to make this come to life. This is part of their Maternal and Child Health Bureau grant. She attended the National Parent & Provider Enrichment Conference & Health Policy Forum in Washington, DC in January and the National Multicultural Conference and Summit in Seattle, Washington.
